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HEALTHY ST. PETE RECOGNIZES ORGANIZATIONS IN ST. PETE THAT PRIORITIZE WELLNESS

St. Petersburg, FL (May 2021) – Healthy St. Pete, an initiative of the City of St. Petersburg and a division of the St. Petersburg Parks and Recreation Department, recognized Healthier Together certified workplaces and neighborhoods last month during the Healthier Together Workshop and Awards.

Healthy St. Pete's Certification Program, developed in 2020, is part of the Healthier Together Initiative and promotes wellness, encourages the adoption of healthy behaviors and establishes supportive communities. Workplaces and neighborhood associations can apply by completing an online assessment that looks at organizational best practices and community health outreach to evaluate the overall quality and comprehensiveness of workplace and neighborhood wellness.

Twenty-seven organizations have received recognition from the City of St. Petersburg and Healthy St. Pete as Healthier Together Certified Workplaces or Neighborhoods. There are three levels of certification: gold, silver and bronze. Gold level partners include: Back2Normal Physical Therapy, Bayfront Health St. Petersburg, City of St. Petersburg, Pinellas County Schools, Raymond James Financial, Tampa Bay Times, Volunteers of America of Florida, W3 Insurance and YMCA of Greater St. Petersburg. Certified partners are recognized at Healthy St. Pete's quarterly Healthier Together Workshops that provide local business professionals and residents an interactive opportunity to network, collaborate and discuss key issues surrounding health and wellness in the community.
